



Will Rogers is a Research Associate and the Joseph S. Nye, Jr. Internship Coordinator at the Center for a New American Security. At CNAS, Rogers's research includes a broad range of science, technology and national security policy issues. His primary research focus is for the Natural Security program where he is a co-editor of and contributor to the Natural Security blog.

He is an author of, most recently, *Sustaining Security: How Natural Resources Influence National Security*, *Lost in Translation: Closing the Gap Between Climate Science and National Security Policy* and *Broadening Horizons: Climate Change and the U.S. Armed Forces*.

Prior to joining CNAS, Rogers was an intern with the Environmental Change and Security Program at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars where he frequently wrote on environmental security for *The New Security Beat*. Previously, he served as a legislative intern in the office of U.S. Senator Barbara Boxer. He has studied abroad at the University of Auckland, in Auckland, New Zealand, where he was a recipient of the 2007 Political Studies Senior Prize Scholarship.
