



Travis Sharp is the Bacevich Fellow at the Center for a New American Security. Prior to joining CNAS, he served as Military Policy Analyst at the Center for Arms Control and Non-Proliferation, where he started as a Herbert Scoville Jr. Peace Fellow. Sharp has published articles in several peer-reviewed journals, including *Joint Force Quarterly*, *Parameters*, and *Defense & Security Analysis*. He has written essays commissioned by numerous think tanks, including the Royal United Services Institute, the Carnegie Council, and the Institute for International Political Studies. He is a regular media commentator and has published op-eds in such venues as the *Christian Science Monitor*, *Washington Times*, *Politico*, *ForeignPolicy.com*, *Defense News*, and *The Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists*.
